Dear Friends at Emanuel,

When we enter the season of Lent, our devotions move toward the Passion of Christ. The Passion of Christ is about the sufferings of Jesus. From His agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, to His arrest, trial and crucifixion, we meditate on the Savior's willingness to go through what no other man has ever endured. The term "passion" comes from the Latin word *patior*, which means "to suffer" or "to endure". His endurance has opened to us the way of forgiveness and eternal life!

As Christians we don't have the option of bypassing the Passion of Christ. We may want to avoid it, but if we do we don't have the true Gospel and all its implications. Each Lenten Season I search for the chance to remind you that to "look at the Crucifix" is to be reminded of the severity of our sin and the enormity of God's love. The Passion is central to our faith in the redemptive work of God.

When we look into the perspectives of the various characters in the Gospels surrounding the events of "The Passion" we can discover a lot about ourselves. We find those who misinterpreted the events, those who rejected the true meaning of why Christ willingly went through it, and those who discovered with the grandest epiphany the true implications the cross brings to us!

That is why I decided to take us on a journey in our mid-week Lenten Devotions entitled **The Passion of Christ from the perspective of...** It will uncover the perspective of six people:



Judas

Peter

Pilate

Mary

The criminal next to Him

The one who Pierced Him



I hope and pray you will come with me on this journey. Starting on Wednesday, March 5th we will have two opportunities to worship each Wednesday in Lent: a morning service at 10:30am and an evening service at 7:00pm. May God Bless you as we walk together through this Season of Lent!
